Waverley Excursions Last year the WAVERLEY ran on 71 days and recorded 52 409 passenger journeys. Timetables for next season will be released "in early spring".

## NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

W Shiel, Seahouses The GLAD TIDINGS II has been sold to Skye Marine and will run wildlife cruises from Edinbane. She was taken by road to the Isle of Skye on 21 December.

## THAMES

At least 15 boats were out on the river in London to celebrate New Year's Eve, and many of them were off Greenwich at midnight for the firework display.

Jetstream Tours, Chatham The URIAH HEEP is being renamed THAMES KESTREL and will be used for the Tilbury ferry.

Woolwich Ferry has been suspended since early December for "ongoing emergency engineering work".

Thames Clippers are to buy Gravesend's Town Pier from Gravesham Borough Council. The pier is used by Jetstream Tours' Tilbury ferry and by the WAVERLEY on her visits to the Thames.

Woods' Silver Fleet "Terrible Thames" cruises with a "horrible histories" show resume on 2 April and run until 1 January 2023 with daily trips in the peak season and school holidays, and otherwise at weekends.

Thames Rivercruise, Reading Public trips will be at weekends from April to October and daily in school holidays, apart from the Reading Festival 22-30 August. Trips to Goring with a cruise towards Moulsoford are on nine dates, starting on 12 May. Afternoon cream tea cruises to Shiplake or Pangbourne are on ten dates.

## SOUTH COAST

Red Funnel Ferries The RED OSPREY left for refit in Falmouth on 4 January.

Isle of Wight Council The floating bridge resumed on 20 December after a break of nearly four months.

Bournemouth-Swanage Motor Road & Ferry Co The BRAMBLE BUSH BAY will go to Falmouth for its next overhaul in November and will have "major mechanical improvements".

## CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The CONDOR VOYAGER returns to service from St-Malo on 18 February after her refit; until then the CONDOR LIBERATION offers a limited service to the islands from Poole and Cherbourg.

## WEST OF ENGLAND

S & M Garrett, Topsham, continue to run the 12-passenger REGNUM and the SEA DREAM II seems unlikely to return to service. Bird watching trips are being offered this winter.

Greenway Ferry Trips from Dartmouth to Greenway resume on 2 March.

T J Tucker, Salcombe The service to South Sands resumes on 2 April.

Isles of Scilly Steamship Co The SCILLONIAN III came out of dry dock on 5 January. Her season is from 21 March to 6 November with sailings daily (except Sundays) from 28 March to 8 October, and otherwise on Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Sunday sailings are from 3 July to 18 September. There is a double trip on 2 and 28 May, 4 June, 30 July, and 6, 20 and 27 August.

#### BRISTOL CHANNEL

Ilfracombe Princess The first trips of the season will be on 15 April.

Bristol Packet Avon Gorge cruises in the BAGHEERA or TOWER BELLE are on 52 dates from 12 March to 18 December.

#### NORTH WEST

National Trust (Enterprises), Coniston The GONDOLA will run from 2 April to 31 October.

#### IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co There was a keel-laying ceremony for the new MANXMAN at Ulsan in South Korea on 24 December.

#### MISCELLANY

The QUEENSFERRY BELLE (ex SARK BELLE, BOURNEMOUTH BELLE) left Southampton on 14 December for delivery to Forth Boat Tours. She sailed via Brighton, Ramsgate, Lowestoft and Grimsby to reach Whitby on 18 December, but was then trapped upstream of the town's swing bridge when it broke and could not be opened.

## NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

P Richardson, Bridlington The YORKSHIRE BELLE is being chartered by the RSPB for seabird cruises on 26 dates from 6 May to 3 September; telephone (01262) 422211.

## EAST ANGLIA

Broads Tours, Wroxham Trips will run daily from 12 to 20 February then from 1 April to 31 October.

## THAMES

Jetstream Tours, Chatham The JACOB MARLEY will offer cruises to the wreck of the RICHARD MONTGOMERY from Queenborough on 12, 13, 19, 20 and 26 February.

Woolwich Ferry The service resumed in January but until 28 March there will be no service on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays owing to strike action.

Thames Clippers Further day trips from Gravesend and Tilbury to London are scheduled for 17 and 19 February. Two more catamarans have been ordered from Wight Shipyard for delivery in autumn 2022 and spring 2023. They will be hybrid, running off batteries in central London. The contract to provide a temporary ferry service at Hammersmith is to be terminated as the bridge has been open to pedestrians since 17 July.

French Brothers Short trips from Windsor run daily from 19 February to 30 October. Runnymede-Windsor runs from 9 April to 25 September and Maidenhead-Windsor from 21 May to 25 September. Runnymede to Hampton Court is on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 14 June to 1 September (except 28 and 30 June). Steamboat trips from Windsor are on most Tuesdays and Saturdays from 24 May to 30 August and on some Sundays.

## SOUTH COAST

Gosport Ferry will not be running any cruises this year.

Wightlink The ST CLARE was at Falmouth from 17 January to 3 February.

Red Funnel Ferries The RED OSPREY left Falmouth on 16 January. The summer car ferry timetable runs from 1 April to 31 October.

City Cruises, Poole The SOLENT SCENE was at Gosport from 5 to 27 January and now has a blue hull like the rest of the fleet. The RIVER ESCAPES FORTUNA is to be renamed POOLE SCENE. Trips to Swanage are daily from 1 April. Evening cruises to the Dancing Ledge to view nesting puffins are on Fridays from 13 May to 1 July.

Dorset Cruises, Poole, will be offering evening party cruises on Fridays and Saturdays from April to August using City Cruises' POOLE SCENE. The DORSET QUEEN has a variety of public cruises including trips to Wareham.

National Trust Brownsea Island will be open to the public from 19 March to 30 October.

## CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The CONDOR VOYAGER went to Falmouth on 10 January. The COMMODORE CLIPPER was unable to carry passengers on 2 February because some crew members had covid; the CONDOR LIBERATION did an extra trip the next day. The government of Guernsey plans to buy a ferry to be leased to Condor.

---

Manche Iles Express Services are to resume in April after a break of two years (apart from a few trips in July 2020).

#### WEST OF ENGLAND

Stuart Line Cruises, Exmouth The first Jurassic Coast cruise of the season is on 25 April and the first to Sidmouth is on 11 May. Day trips to Torquay and Brixham are on Thursdays from 26 May to 29 September. Special trips include Brixham for the pirate festival on 30 April and 2 May, and geology day cruises on 20 May and 13 September.

Funfish Trips, Brixham Trips from Brixham, Paignton and Torquay to Teignmouth, returning by train, are on Wednesdays and Saturdays from 2 April to 29 October.

Sam Pill (Cornish Pleasure Cruises), Falmouth The ENTERPRISE III is being renamed DIXIE BELLE and will begin running daily trips to the Helford River in April.

Isles of Scilly Steamship Co The SCILLONIAN III came out of dry dock on 5 January. The ship's new master is Victoria Bolitho, the first woman in the post, replacing Pete Crawford who has retired.

#### BRISTOL CHANNEL

Lundy Company The OLDENBURG returned to Bideford on 3 February after her refit at Sharpness.

Bristol Packet 45-minute harbour cruises are running at weekends and will be daily in school holidays.

Bristol Ferry Boats will offer 1-hour harbour cruises during the school half-term holiday in February.

#### NORTH WEST

ChesterBoat Daily 30-minute cruises run from 19 February.

Mersey Ferries The service was suspended from 3 to 20 January owing to mechanical problems in the ROYAL IRIS OF THE MERSEY; the SNOWDROP was off service for a refit. 3-hour cruises into Liverpool Bay are scheduled for 11, 12 and 25 June, and 10 July.

Daniel Adamson Preservation Society The DANIEL ADAMSON will be in the Albert Dock, Liverpool, from 4 to 14 April, available for charter, and with guided tours available on the 9th and 10th.

Keswick Launch Co Trips run from 12 to 27 February, on 5-6 March then daily from 12 March to 6 November.

Ullswater 'Steamers' The summer timetable, from 28 March to 29 October, follows the usual pattern.

#### MISCELLANY

The QUEENSFERRY BELLE (ex SARK BELLE, BOURNEMOUTH BELLE) left Whitby on 11 January after spending 23 days there and sailed via Amble to Arbroath where she is being refitted for Forth Boat Tours.

The former Gosport Ferry PORTSMOUTH QUEEN is now on her way to Guernsey where she is to become a static restaurant. She left Gosport in February 2016 and conversion to a party boat named LONDON QUEEN was started, but she has since been laid-up in Queenborough.

Waverley Excursions A timetable has been published for Clyde sailings from 16 June to 28 August.

## NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

W Shiell, Seahouses Trips to land on Holy Island are on various dates between 1 May and 28 October.

## EAST ANGLIA

Sailing Barge Victor, Ipswich Afternoon cream tea cruises and evening supper cruises are on various dates from 20 May to 30 September.

## THAMES

Jetstream Tours, Chatham The summer programme, from 9 April, includes trips from Chatham to Southend, Southend to Queenborough, cruises to the Red Sand Towers, to the wreck of the RICHARD MONTGOMERY, or round the Isle of Sheppey.

'Lady Daphne' After a major refit in Oare Creek near Faversham, the sailing barge will move to a new home at Charlestown in Cornwall. She has belonged to her present owners since 2016 and offered cruises on the Thames until the autumn of 2019.

Thames River Sightseeing The current hourly service from Westminster, Embankment, Festival, Bankside, Tower Bridge Quay and Greenwich continues to 31 March, then there will be sailings every 40 minutes. No cruises to the Thames Barrier are scheduled.

Thames Clippers Further trips from Gravesend and Tilbury to London were scheduled for 5 and 19 March.

Bateaux London The HARMONY arrived in Lowestoft for refit on 1 March.

London Party Boats The ARCADIAN KING EDWARD, bought from King Cruises last year, is being renamed EMERALD OF LONDON.

Thames Boats The HIGH SOCIETY has not returned to service since sinking at her mooring in May 2018. She is now for sale at Gillingham on the Medway.

Hobbs of Henley The CONSUTA II has been advertised for sale by brokers for £98 750.

Salter's Steamers An Oxford-Abingdon service will run from 25 July to 1 September on Mondays to Thursdays. There will also be short cruises from Oxford and Marlow, and on 4 and 5 September from Wallingford for the Bunkfest event.

## SOUTH COAST

City Cruises, Poole The Swanage service runs from 1 April to 31 October and there will be an increased service with six round trips daily instead of three, using two ships.

National Trust Visits to Brownsea Island this year must again be booked with the Trust. There will be seven sailings a day from Poole and none from Sandbanks, in boats of Brownsea Island Ferries. The adult price of £21.50 includes the boat trip.

Coastline Cruises, Weymouth The business, with two boats, has been advertised for sale for £125 000.

---

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries After her refit in Falmouth, the CONDOR VOYAGER sailed to St-Malo on 8 February and is now back in service.

WEST OF ENGLAND

Stuart Line Cruises, Exmouth There will be a day trip to Dartmouth on 27 August for the annual regatta.

J & M Rackley, Starcross The ferry will run from 7 to 24 April then from mid-May to 31 October.

Dartmouth Steam Railway & River Boat Co Totnes sailings run from 2 April to 27 October and in July and August are daily except Fridays, and otherwise two to five days a week, with two round trips each day.

Plymouth Boat Trips Trips to Calstock are on 26 dates from 27 April, most also calling at Cotehele. River Yealm cruises are on 23 dates from 10 April. Breakwater cruises and sunset cruises are also in the programme but the River Lynher cruises are not advertised this year.

J & F Pill (Falmouth Pleasure Cruises) The PRINCESSA will begin her season on 20 March.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Bristol Ferry Boats The service has resumed after a break of two years, and links Temple Meads, City Centre, ss GREAT BRITAIN and Cottage Inn.

Matthew of Bristol Public trips begin with an Avon Gorge cruise on 9 April.

Avon River Cruises, Bristol Both boats are for sale: the SILVER SALMON with her business for £135 000, and the SPIRIT OF FREEDOM for £80 000.

MIDLAND WATERWAYS

Trent River Cruises, Nottingham A liquidator was appointed on 31 January.

Boston Belle River & Sea Trips Cruises into the Wash are scheduled for 16 dates from 12 April.

NORTH WEST

ChesterBoat 2-hour cruises to Aldford Iron Bridge are on selected dates from 9 March.

National Waterways Museum Ellesmere Port, will offer trips at Easter using a 12-passenger boat from Wirral Community Narrowboat Trust.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The MANANNAN went to Falmouth for refit, arriving on 26 February.

Waverley Excursions Clyde sailings are due to begin in late-May. The WAVERLEY visits the Western Isles between 6 and 13 June, with sailings from Oban and Kyle of Lochalsh. After the Clyde season, she may visit Liverpool, the Bristol Channel, South Coast and Thames, but confirmation is awaited.

## NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

P Richardson, Bridlington The YORKSHIRE BELLE returned to Bridlington on 7 March after dry docking in Hull and cruises are expected to commence on 9 April.

Yorkshire Hire Cruisers, Leeds, ceased trading in 2020. The KIRKSTALL FLYBOAT has been advertised for sale with the HORBURY, used as an office and store, for £135 000.

## EAST ANGLIA

Harwich Harbour Ferry Services was the buyer of the HAVEN CRUISER from Great Yarmouth. She now has hybrid propulsion, with an electric motor, and has a shelter and toilet. She will be used for seal-watching cruises with the GLORIA.

## THAMES

Thames River Sightseeing Sailings continue to be hourly and the increased service at 40-minute intervals is postponed to 11 April. Bateaux London The HARMONY returned to London on 18 March after her refit in Lowestoft.

Thames River Boats Sailings from Richmond to Hampton Court began on 2 April and services from Westminster start on 15 April.

## SOUTH COAST

Bodiam Boating Station The DANNIE LEE is returning to service after a break of two years but will be limited to 12 passengers and will only be available for private hire.

Wightlink Summer timetables have a three-ship service to Fishbourne with sailings every 40 minutes, and an hourly two-ship service to Yarmouth.

Red Funnel Ferries The RED EAGLE was at Falmouth from 11 to 25 February.

Isle of Wight Council The floating bridge is suspended from 7 March to 22 April for its 5-year survey. It left under tow for Falmouth on 17 April.

Dorset Belle Pleasure Cruises, Bournemouth, plan to begin the season this month. 2-hour evening cruises from Poole will run on Fridays from 15 April.

City Cruises, Poole The SOLENT SCENE began Swanage sailings on 1 April and the full two-ship service is due to start on 13 April. The RIVER ESCAPES FORTUNA began running on 2 April doing cruises to Old Harry; she will be renamed POOLE SCENE in the autumn.

## CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The COMMODORE CLIPPER's refit, planned for September, was brought forward and she was dry-docked between 21 March and 3 April in Falmouth. The CONDOR VOYAGER was at Falmouth from 15 to 29 March. Since 1 April the CONDOR LIBERATION is making a twice-weekly round trip from Guernsey to Cherbourg with a crossing time of two and a half hours.

---

Manche Iles Express The season is from 28 April to 25 September, with both vessels in use from 4 June to 31 August. There are Alderney sailings on seven dates.

#### WEST OF ENGLAND

Stuart Line Cruises, Exmouth The PRIDE OF EXMOUTH went to Polruan on 24 March for her refit.

J & M Rackley, Starcross The ORCOMBE is now expected to run the ferry from 9 to 23 April and will then be replaced by the PRINCESS MARINA for a while. The PRINCESS MARINA is expected to resume trips from Dawlish this summer after a break of two years.

Kingsbridge Salcombe Ferry Co will start on 11 April.

Mevagissey Ferries will run from 26 April to 3 October.

Fal River Sailings from Falmouth to Trelissick run from 1 April to 30 October, with four trips daily. On 12 dates there is a high tide trip to Truro, with the first on 16 April.

Truro River Cruises will not be running this year "due to unforeseen circumstances".

Tresco Boat Services The VOYAGER OF ST MARTIN'S, sold in 2019, has been rebuilt in Ireland and began running between New Ross and Waterford in March as the BARROW PRINCESS.

#### BRISTOL CHANNEL

Lundy Company The OLDENBURG has a Bideford-Ilfracombe coastal trip on 22 April.

Bristol Ferry Boats There are more trips to Beese's Riverside Bar this season, on some Thursdays and weekends.

Cardiff Cruises The LEWIS ALEXANDER began trips to Flat Holm in March. She was built to serve the island in 1989 but had not been there since 2013. Sailing times vary with tides and allow three hours on the island.

#### WEST WALES

Carmarthen Bay Ferries After a break of two years, trips are due to resume on 15 April.

#### MIDLAND WATERWAYS

Bosworth Cruises, Birmingham The BOSWORTH LADY is now run by Brindley Cruises. Telephone mobile 07853 226516.

Princess River Cruises, Nottingham The NOTTINGHAM PRINCE is being offered for sale for £65 000.

#### IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The MANANNAN returned to service on 1 April. The hull of the new MANXMAN is now afloat in Korea.

#### MISCELLANY

The former Gosport ferry PORTSMOUTH QUEEN arrived in St Peter Port on 16 March from Ramsgate after spending ten days in Gosport. She is to be converted to a static floating restaurant.

Waverley Excursions The WAVERLEY was in dry dock at Greenock from 19 to 29 April. Details of sailings after 28 August, and a possible visit to England and Wales, are still awaited.

## NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

Whitby Coastal Cruises The ESK BELLE III has been rebuilt with a central wheelhouse. Originally the QUEEN OF CORNWALL at Padstow, she later ran from Ilfracombe then Tenby, and has been at Whitby since 2012.

## THAMES

'Lady Daphne' The sailing barge arrived in her new base at Charlestown in Cornwall on 18 April.

Thames River Sightseeing From 30 May to 5 September, sailings will be half-hourly, requiring five boats. There will be no cruises to the Thames Barrier. Cruises from Westminster to the Barrier began in 1981 and ran every year until the pandemic.

Thames Clippers began serving Barking Riverside on 22 April. The new pier on the north bank is the easternmost on the Clippers' regular service.

Thames Steamers The ALASKA will offer 50-minute public trips from Bourne End during the Bank Holiday weekends of 2-5 June and 27-29 August.

## SOUTH COAST

Chichester Harbour Water Tours Trips are now in a 12-passenger boat and not the WINGATE III.

Solent Party Ship Cruises, Southampton The PRINCESS CAROLINE will be delivered in September to new Finnish owners, Rosita Risteilyt of Turku who already own the former BON MARIN DE SERK from the Isle of Sark Shipping Co. The PRINCESS CAROLINE has been based at Southampton since 2004.

Isle of Wight Council The floating bridge was towed back to Cowes on 4 April and returned to service on 23 April.

Dorset Belle Pleasure Cruises, Bournemouth Trips from Bournemouth began on 25 April. Swanage Pier Trust has refused permission for the DORSET BELLE to call because the volunteer pier staff are busy with the additional sailings of City Cruises.

City Cruises, Poole The first calls at Swanage were on 9 April when the pier reopened after repairs. The PURBECK PRIDE is being chartered from Greenslade for the season in addition to the SOLENT CAT which arrived on 28 April to begin her third season on charter from Solent Cruises to City Cruises.

Coastline Cruises, Weymouth The Portland service resumed on 15 April.

## CHANNEL ISLANDS

Manche Iles Express The VICTOR HUGO made the first trip of the season on 28 April, from Carteret to Jersey.

## WEST OF ENGLAND

J & M Rackley, Starcross The ferry is suspended from 25 April to 17 May.

---

Western Lady Ferry Service The season began on 2 April. Boats sail from the Haldon Pier in Torquay.

Dartmouth Steam Railway & River Boat Co Day trips from Torquay and Brixham to Dartmouth started on 16 April. The DART VENTURER and DITTISHAM PRINCESS are based at Torquay and also provide the Western Lady service.

Drake's Island, Plymouth Access to the island for guided tours is this year from the Barbican in vessels of Plymouth Boat Trips. The tours are on Fridays Saturdays and Sundays.

Fal River A 2½-hour "Creekside archaeology cruise" from Falmouth is scheduled for 19 May.

#### MIDLAND WATERWAYS

National Waterways Museum Gloucester The QUEEN BOADICEA II began her season on 20 April. 45-minute trips run from Tuesdays to Saturdays.

Newark Castle Line The SONNING's season started on 15 April.

Boston Belle River & Sea Trips The start of the season was delayed, and the PRINCE GEORGE began river trips on 17 April.

#### NORTH WEST

Ullswater 'Steamers' The RAVEN was back in the water on 3 May after a major refit including renewal of the upper deck and saloon interior.

#### IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The BEN-MY-CHREE went to Birkenhead for refit on 25 April and is due to return to service on 10 May. She will offer a 4-hour cruise round the island on 18 June at a fare of £35 including a meal.

# TRIP OUT

**June 2022**

As we hope the pandemic is over, there are many boat trips on offer but some operators have not survived and the business faces many problems: rising costs, a shortage of crew and more stringent MCA rules. For older boats that no longer carry passengers, the usual fate is as a houseboat.

There are few new vessels to replace the old ones, but Blyth Catamarans have become prolific builders of passenger boats, delivering three in the past year: the ISLE OF HERM for Guernsey, the DALE QUEEN for Pembrokeshire and the latest, the SERENITY IV.

I hope that a new printed edition of the guide to passenger boat services will be ready later this month, while the information will also be online.

Berwick Boat Trips The longest trip offered by the BORDER BELLE is an occasional 3½-hour cruise along the Scottish coast to St Abbs Head. The GIRL KATHERINE II, bought from Arbroath in 2020, is limited to 12 passengers.

A & T Douglas, Seahouses The SERENITY IV has been built by Blyth Catamarans in Essex. She is a 15-m catamaran able to carry 120 passengers, with a shelter on the main deck and an upper passenger deck. Now the largest passenger boat in Seahouses, her maiden passenger trips were on 30 May. (photograph from owners)

The sailing on 23 August was cancelled because of maintenance of a steam pump. She completed her Clyde programme on 28 August and left for the south coast the next day, arriving off the Isle of Wight on the 31st. South Coast sailings began as scheduled on 2 September but the next day a fault caused the cancellation of a cruise round the island. The weather curtailed the sailing on 6 September and caused the next day to be cancelled.

W Shiel, Seahouses The GLAD TIDINGS III has been advertised for sale for £12 345. She was built at Seahouses for the present owners in 1971.

Graceful Swan, Skipton The 54-seat electric restaurant boat GRACEFUL SWAN was built in 2019 for the Rendezvous Hotel and was ready to run on the Leeds & Liverpool Canal from the hotel in the spring of 2020, but seems to have had little use because of the pandemic and other problems. She is for sale for £474 950.

## THAMES

Lee & Stort Boat Co has been unable to serve Hertford this year because of redevelopment. Occasional 3-hour cruises have been run from Ware, and Hertford trips are expected to resume next year.

Western Lady Ferry Service Torquay-Brixham sailings will be on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays in October.

Dartmouth Steam Railway & River Boat Co From November to March river cruises from Dartmouth are on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and also on Saturdays in March.

Isles of Scilly Steamship Co Next year the SCILLONIAN III will run from 20 March to 5 November.

Bournemouth-Swanage Motor Road & Ferry Co The ferry's last day of service before her refit was 30 October.

Condor Ferries The Finnish cargo ferry MIDAS was chartered while the COMMODORE GOODWILL was in Spain for a refit, making her first trial call at St Peter Port on 25 October.

The ferry was damaged during the tow and is not expected to return to service until the New Year. The ferry company says "a letter has been issued to the tug company holding them fully responsible."

Condor Ferries The COMMODORE CLIPPER was out of service for repairs from 13 to 20 November and was dry docked in Belfast between 16 and 18 November.

WEST OF ENGLAND

Plymouth Boat Trips Harbour cruises run on Saturdays this month, then daily from 26 December to 1 January and from 1 April to 29 October 2+023. There is a service from the Barbican and Royal William Yard to Cremyll on 10 and 11 December for the Mount Edgcombe Christmas Fayre.

Isles of Scilly Steamship Co The SCILLONIAN III was in the Penzance dry dock from 9 to 25 November.

NORTH WEST

Wyre Council The Knott End ferry is running a restricted service because of "staff absence" and there is a service on only 17 days this month.

Windermere Lake Cruises The SWIFT has been off service for maintenance since early October so the TEAL has been used for charters and occasional winter sailings instead of the smaller launches.
