January 2023

Waverley Excursions The WAVERLEY's season is planned to start on 19 May and she will go to Oban and the inner Hebrides between 23 and 29 May, the Bristol Channel from 2 to 18 June then Liverpool and Llandudno on 20-21 June. She is on the South Coast from 1 September and on the Thames from 22 September to 8 October.

EAST ANGLIA

Broads Tours, Wroxham There are trips on 11-19 February, 19 March then daily from 1 April to 31 October.

THAMES

Jetstream Tours, Chatham There are cruises from Queenborough to the wreck of the RICHARD MONTGOMERY on some weekends from 14 January. Other public trips, including Southend and the Red Sand Towers, resume on 1 April.

Thames River Sightseeing There is a reduced three-boat service in January and February with hourly sailings.

Woods' Silver Fleet The SILVER STURGEON arrived in Lowestoft for refit on 5 January.

SOUTH COAST

Ross Boat Trips, Brighton The 85-passenger catamaran GLADIATOR has been delivered to Brighton and will begin running in March.

Red Funnel Ferries The RED EAGLE went to Falmouth on 9 December for refit and only two car ferries were in service over the Christmas period.

Blue Funnel Cruises announced on 21 December that the Hythe ferry was losing money and would have to close on the 31st, but later said that it will continue while there are discussions with a potential new operator. The OCEAN SCENE's summer programme includes cruises to the Beaulieu River on 22 May, 21 June, 13 July and 16 August.

City Cruises, Poole Coastal cruises resume on 1 April and, as well as the usual trips to Swanage, there are 1½-hour cruises to Old Harry's Rock. Cruises to the Dancing Ledge to see nesting puffins are on Friday evenings from 12 May to 30 June.

Bournemouth-Swanage Motor Road & Ferry Co The ferry is now expected to resume in February after repairs in Falmouth.

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The CONDOR LIBERATION was dry docked in Falmouth between 9 November and 12 December.

Manche Iles Express Granville sailings run from 22 April to 17 September; Carteret and Diélette are served from 1 May to 24 September. Alderney is served on seven dates.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Lundy Company The OLDENBURG went to Sharpness on 14 November for her refit.

NORTH WEST

ChesterBoat 30-minute trips are due to run daily from 7 January. National Waterways Museum Ellesmere Port Daily trips will run between 18 and 26 February in a 12-passenger boat of Wirral Community Narrowboat Trust.

Daniel Adamson Preservation Society Public cruises are on 31 dates from 26 March to 8 October, with trips from Sutton Weaver, Acton Bridge and Anderton on the river Weaver, Ellesmere Port and Liverpool. There is a sailings on the Manchester Ship Canal to and from Mode Wheel Lock in Salford on 26-27 August.

Ullswater 'Steamers' The one-boat winter service continues to 25 March. A three-boat schedule runs from 26 March with a full four-boat service from 27 May to 4 September.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The new MANXMAN carried out her first sea trials off South Korea on 10 December. She is scheduled to replace the BEN-MY-CHREE on 23 May.

TRIP OUT

February 2023

New regulations on safety standards for passenger ships have been approved by parliament and vessels must comply by the first survey after 28 December 2024. Changes include additional liferafts and life jackets, fire detection and extinction, bilge pumps and alarms, and new stability requirements.

Waverley Excursions An appeal was launched on 19 January to raise the £180 000 needed for the ship's dry docking.

NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

W Shiel, Seahouses The GLAD TIDINGS VI has been advertised for sale.

P Richardson, Bridlington The YORKSHIRE BELLE went to Hull on 9 November, but her dry-docking was delayed until 27 January. She is again being chartered by the RSPB for birdwatching cruises; there are trips on 28 dates from 7 May to 16 September; telephone (01262) 422211.

THAMES

Thames River Sightseeing Sailings will be every 40 minutes in March then half-hourly from 1 April.

London Party Boats The WYNDHAM GRAND has been renamed ONYX OF LONDON and is advertised as available for charter from March. The company, established in 2003, now has five boats.

Thames Luxury Charters THE EDWARDIAN has been advertised for sale.

Thames Steamers The ALASKA will offer public trips from Bourne End on Bank Holiday weekends, 27-29 May and 26-28 August. There will be some special trips to mark the steamer's 140th birthday.

Salter's Steamers The only public service is Oxford-Abingdon which runs on Mondays to Thursdays from 24 July to 31 August. As usual 40-minute trips will run from Oxford and Marlow.

SOUTH COAST

Wightlink The ST CLARE arrived in Falmouth for refit on 25 January.

The Solent Steam Packet There will be an additional public cruise on 24 June to mark the 75th anniversary of the arrival of the EMPIRE WINDRUSH with Caribbean immigrants.

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Isle of Sark Shipping Co The CORSAIRE DE SERCQ went to St-Malo, her previous home port, on 23 January for refit.

Jersey Duchess Two-hour public cruises will run from 7 April to 22 October.

Manche Iles Express There was a reduction in the number of passengers last season because French citizens now need a passport and can no longer use their national identity cards to visit the islands. As a consequence there are fears the service will cease after the 2023 season.

WEST OF ENGLAND

Stuart Line Cruises, Exmouth There are trips to Brixham Pirate Festival on 29 April and 1 May. The first Sidmouth trip is on 30 April. Day trips to Torquay and Brixham are on Thursdays from 25 May to 28 September. There is a day trip to Dartmouth on 26 August for the regatta.

Paignton Belle (Yellow Boat Cruises) has ceased trading. They ran from Paignton and Torquay in 2021 and 2022 with the PRIDE OF PAIGNTON, originally the Dartmouth ferry ADRIAN GILBERT.

Dartmouth Steam Railway & River Boat Co Totnes sailings run from 4 April to 26 October with two round trips on up to six days a week. A new contract with the Paddle Steamer Kingswear Castle Trust was signed in January to keep the KINGSWEAR CASTLE on the Dart for the next 25 years.

Greenway Ferry The CHRISTIE BELLE's Dartmouth-Greenway service runs daily from 2 March.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Bristol Packet Avon Gorge cruises are scheduled for 50 dates from 19 March to 7 December. The narrow boat REDSHANK, used for harbour cruises, is being converted to electric drive. Day trips to Bath are no longer advertised.

Bristol Ferry Boats Trips upriver to Beese's Riverside Bar are offered at weekends from 1 April and on some Thursdays. The company no longer offers Avon Gorge cruises.

MIDLAND WATERWAYS

Princess River Cruises, Nottingham The NOTTINGHAM PRINCE was sold last year and is now in Manchester.

Lincoln Boat Trips The BRAYFORD BELLE's trips begin on 7 April.

Friends of the Cromford Canal There will be no horse-drawn trips as the horse has died. Powered trips are due to resume in April.

NORTH WEST

Manchester River Cruises were the buyers of the NOTTINGHAM PRINCE which has been renamed ISABELLA. She will run with the PRINCESS KATHERINE.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co Delivery of the MANXMAN will be delayed because of a gearbox fault discovered during sea trials. The BEN-MY-CHREE will continue as the main vessel until the MANXMAN is ready.

David Attenborough's new BBC TV series on the wildlife of the British Isles will feature the puffins on Skomer island off West Wales. Our wildlife is already a big attraction on boat trips with people keen to see puffins, seals, dolphins and other creatures. Seahouses, a fishing village in Northumberland, has more passenger boats than any holiday resort. Winter bird-watching cruises attract passengers to boats on Poole Harbour and the Exe estuary. With many passenger boats dependent on wildlife, any media attention is to be welcomed.

Waverley Excursions Timetables have been published for sailings in Scotland in May and on 14-15 October. The dry dock appeal had raised £150 000 by 28 February towards the £180 000 needed for this year's refit.

NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

Boats to the Farne Islands will be unable to land passengers on Inner Farne and Staple Islands because of bird flu, but will continue to offer cruises round the islands and visits to Longstone as last year.

THAMES

Woolwich Ferry The service was suspended from 18 February to 5 March for "essential engineering works" at the terminals. The two ferries went to Chatham for maintenance.

Thames River Boats There are trips between Richmond and Hampton Court on 18, 19, 25 and 26 March. Daily sailings from Westminster to Kew, Richmond and Hampton Court start on 1 April.

Thames Luxury Charters The DIXIE QUEEN arrived in Lowestoft for refit on 14 February.

Turk Launches Hampton Court trips start on 25 March. Richmond services are at weekends in April.

SOUTH COAST

Wightlink The ST CLARE returned to Portsmouth from Falmouth on 7 February. On the Lymington route, the summer timetable from 27 March to 10 September has two ships with hourly sailings.

Red Funnel Ferries The Southampton car ferry terminal will be closed for repairs on 5-9 and 19-23 March; ferries will run from berth 25 in the docks with a connecting bus for foot passengers. The summer car ferry schedule with hourly sailings runs from 31 March to 31 October.

Greenslade Pleasure Boats, Poole An extensive programme of bird-watching cruises on Poole Harbour and round the coast in boats chartered from Greenslade is offered by Birds of Poole Harbour (telephone 01202 641003).

Bournemouth-Swanage Motor Road & Ferry Co The BRAMBLE BUSH BAY was towed back into Poole Harbour by the tug MERCIA on 7 February and was put back on the chains on the 17th. The service resumed on 27 February after a break of nearly four months.

WEST OF ENGLAND

Funfish Trips, Brixham, have bought the PRIDE OF PAIGNTON and she now carries their orange, red and yellow livery.

Plymouth Boat Trips Harbour cruises and the Cawsand service will run daily from 1 April to 29 October. Calstock trips are on 28 dates from 3 April to 24 October, most also calling at Cotehele, and cruises to the river Yealm are on 26 dates. Fishing trips are no longer advertised and the RONNOCH MOR has been offered for sale.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Ilfracombe Coastal Cruises The ILFRACOMBE PRINCESS begins her season 2 April. Last year she carried 18 759 passengers on 311 trips.

MIDLAND WATERWAYS

Boston Belle River & Sea Trips The BOSTON BELLE's 4½-hour cruises into the Wash to see seals are on 14 dates from 28 April to 5 October. The PRINCE GEORGE offers river cruises on Wednesdays and Sundays.

NORTH WEST

Mersey Ferries Manchester Ship Canal cruises to Latchford and back are scheduled for just nine dates this year. There are Liverpool Bay cruises on four dates and a 3-hour RSPB bird-watching cruise is scheduled for 1 July.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The BEN-MY-CHREE is to be dry-docked in Birkenhead between 23 and 30 March. The MANANNAN will cover daytime sailings to Heysham while the ARROW will do overnight freight services.

Waverley Excursions The WAVERLEY went from Glasgow to Greenock on 16 March and was in dry dock until the 25th. The appeal has raised the necessary £180 000 to complete her refit. The WAVERLEY will sail from Liverpool to Llandudno on 20 and 21 June; afternoon cruises from Llandudno on both dates are already "sold out".

NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

P Richardson, Bridlington The start of the YORKSHIRE BELLE's season is delayed until 29 April.

THAMES

Lee & Stort Boat Co will be unable to run to Hertford because of redevelopment there. On seven Saturdays there will be a 3-hour cruise from Ware downriver to Stanstead Abbots. From Stratford there is a 3-hour cruise on the last Sunday of each month.

Thames Cruises All five boats have been advertised for sale.

French Brothers The service from Runnymede and Staines to Hampton Court runs on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 13 June to 7 September, except 27 and 29 June. One-hour steamboat cruises from Windsor are on various dates from 3 June; steamboat trips between Runnymede and Windsor are on 21 May, 18 June and 24 September.

SOUTH COAST

Wightlink The WIGHT SUN was dry docked at Falmouth in March.

Red Funnel Ferries The RED EAGLE arrived back from Falmouth on 2 April after a stay of nearly four months. The start of the summer car ferry timetable is delayed until 6 April, and there will be a reduced service between 17 and 27 April.

'Coral Star', Yarmouth A catamaran to carry over 100 passengers has been ordered from Blyth Catamarans for delivery in 2024. It will be similar to the SERENITY IV, built last year to run from Seahouses, and will run a regular service to Lymington under the name Quay 2 Quay.

Dorset Belle Pleasure Cruises, Bournemouth The DORSET BELLE has a new owner, Colin Palmer, after five years with Dave Wilcock who ran her on the Thames estuary then Bournemouth. She made her first trips of the season on 2 April.

Greenslade Pleasure Boats, Poole Harbour cruises are daily from 2 April. The PURBECK GEM's trips to Wareham are on various dates from 7 May to 7 October.

CHANNEL ISLANDS

The governments of Jersey and Guernsey plan to relax entry rules for French day trippers to allow them to visit with their national identity card instead of a passport.

Condor Ferries The STRAITSMAN is being bought from Bluebridge in New Zealand with finance from the Guernsey government. A near-sister of the COMMODORE CLIPPER, she was built in 2005 to run to the Danish island of Bornholm as the DUEODDE, and has been in New Zealand since 2010. She made her last trips between North and South Islands in March and is due to reach British waters in June. She will run from Portsmouth as the CONDOR ISLANDER.

WEST OF ENGLAND

Stuart Line Cruises, Exmouth The PRIDE OF EXMOUTH has gone to Portland for her annual refit. Her first coastal cruise from Exmouth is due on 19 April. All-day geology cruises are on 11 May and 18 September; evening cruises to Countess Wear are on 20 May and 2 August; cruises to air shows are on 3 and 4 June in Tor Bay, 1 July in Teignmouth and 25 August in Sidmouth.

J & M Rackley, Starcross The Exmouth ferry begins on 5 April.

Dartmouth Steam Railway & River Boat Co The KINGSWEAR CASTLE is expected to return to service in July.

Mevagissey Ferries The season is due to start on 27 April.

Fal River From 1 April to 28 October there are sailings to Trelissick and Malpas, but there is no connecting bus from Malpas and no car parking there.

Isles of Scilly Steamship Co The SCILLONIAN III made her first trip of the season as scheduled on 20 March.

Jubilee Queen, Padstow The season starts on 6 April.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Lundy Company The OLDENBURG's return to service, scheduled for 28 March, has been delayed until at least 2 May. She has been at Sharpness since 14 November but work has been held up by "unexpected winter damage and a subsequent delay in key parts arriving from overseas."

Bristol Ferry Boats The EMILY has returned to service after being rebuilt.

NORTH WEST

Anderton Boat Lift After being closed for repairs since last July, the lift reopens on 7 April and the EDWIN CLARK will be able to resume trips on the lift.

Mersey Ferries Special 'Eurovision' cruises will run between 5 and 13 May as the contest is held in Liverpool.

Windermere Lake Cruises Services from Bowness to Ferry House and from Lakeside to Fell Foot Park resume this year for the first time since 2019.

National Trust (Enterprises), Coniston After engine and shaft repairs are completed, the GONDOLA's season should start on 7 April.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co After running to Heysham while the BEN-MY-CHREE was dry-docked, the MANANNAN began running from Liverpool on 31 March as scheduled.

Waverley Excursions The WAVERLEY returned to Glasgow from Greenock on 12 April after dry-docking. Her first sailing is from Glasgow on 19 May and she goes to Oban on the 23rd. After completing her sailings from Oban on 29 May, the WAVERLEY has an evening cruise from Warrenpoint on 30 May, then runs on the Bristol Channel from 2 June, finishing with cruises from Milford Haven on 18 June. Ports of call include Portishead, Porthcawl, Weston and Tenby.

NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

P Richardson, Bridlington The YORKSHIRE BELLE returned from Hull on 23 April and trips from Bridlington started on 29 April.

THAMES

Oceandiva The OCEANDIVA has been launched at the Veka shipyard in Lemmer in the Netherlands. She sailed to Amsterdam on 30 April.

Thames Clippers The first of two new hybrid catamarans is named EARTH CLIPPER and was launched by Wight Shipyard Co at East Cowes in April.

Thames Rivercruise, Reading Special cruises to celebrate the history of the PRINCESS MARINA are scheduled for 17 May, 14 June, 12 July and 9 August.

SOUTH COAST

Red Funnel Ferries The RED OSPREY went to Falmouth on 17 April and returned to Southampton on 5 May when the summer three-ship timetable belatedly started.

The Solent Steam Packet The SHIELDHALL left Southampton on 16 April for dry docking in Falmouth and was back on 3 May.

City Cruises, Poole, are buying the catamaran CLYDE CLIPPER from Clyde Marine Services. She was built by David Abels in Bristol in 2009 for service on the Clyde but has seen little use in recent years. She is currently in the Ardmaleish boatyard near Rothesay and is due in Poole in a few weeks. The HARBOUR SCENE is not scheduled to sail this season but is moored at Poole Quay. The PURBECK PRIDE, acquired last year from Greenslade, is now in City Cruises' colours with a blue hull.

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The STRAITSMAN was renamed CONDOR ISLANDER and registered in the Bahamas before leaving Wellington on 19 April to sail via Tahiti and the Panama Canal.

WEST OF ENGLAND

River Exe Café, Exmouth, is a restaurant on a purpose-built static barge in the estuary, with access by boat from Exmouth. Two 12-passenger boats have been used but the MEDINA MIST has been bought from Falmouth.

M Pill, Falmouth The MEDINA MIST left Falmouth on 29 April to go to her new owners in Exmouth. She had run in Falmouth since 2006, initially as the HAVEN ROSE then reverting to her original name of MEDINA MIST in 2010.

Fal River High-tide trips from Falmouth to Truro are on seven dates from 20 April to 15 September.

Isles of Scilly Steamship Co announced on 18 April that private finance had been arranged to build replacements for the SCILLONIAN III and the cargo vessels GRY MARITHA and LYONESSE LADY. Lombard NatWest will lend £33.6 million for the new vessels which will be delivered by March 2026. The Steamship company is in discussions with several shipyards.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Lundy Company The OLDENBURG's return to service has been delayed further and she will not be running to Lundy until at least 20 May.

MIDLAND WATERWAYS

National Waterways Museum Gloucester has opened a summer exhibition about the history of the QUEEN BOADICEA II but boat trips have not yet started.

NORTH WEST

Westmorland & Furness Council Since 1 April this new authority has replaced Cumbria County Council as operator of the Windermere ferry.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The new MANXMAN is due to be handed over on 10 May and should arrive in British waters in June.

Waverley Excursions The WAVERLEY completed her Scottish sailings in fine weather with good passenger numbers. After a sold-out evening cruise from Warrenpoint on 30 May, she called at Ilfracombe the next day and began her Bristol Channel cruises on 2 June. She continues until 18 June but most trips are now sold out. The south coast timetables were published on 8 May. Sailings between 1 and 20 September include calls at Poole, Ryde and, for the first time ever, Shoreham.

NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

W Shiel, Seahouses The GLAD TIDINGS is for sale for £18 000.

EAST ANGLIA

Harwich Harbour Ferry Services The GLORIA has been sold after five years at Harwich and was transported by road to the new owner in Falmouth.

THAMES

Oceandiva The OCEAN DIVA left IJmuiden on 18 May and was towed by the tug KINGSTON to Tilbury. On the 20th local tugs took her up to the King George V Dock at North Woolwich for fitting out, trials and crew training. With a length of 86 m, a beam of 17 m and three passenger decks, she will only be able to operate downstream of London Bridge. She will be available for charter for functions and events, with passenger capacity initially limited to 400.

Thames River Boats Since 29 May the PRINCESS FREDA has been calling at Hammerton's Ferry in Twickenham on her trips from Richmond to Hampton Court.

Bygone Boating, Benson, started a ferry service on 7 May, replacing a footbridge over Benson Weir which is unsafe and expected to take three years to replace. Telephone mobile 07375 677823.

SOUTH COAST

Dorset Belle Pleasure Cruises, Bournemouth The DORSET BELLE was detained by police on 1 June following a tragedy on 31 May when two young people were drowned whilst swimming at Bournemouth. The police said the victims had not been in contact with any boat, but the causes are still being investigated while the DORSET BELLE's trips have not resumed.

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The CONDOR ISLANDER has passed through the Panama Canal and, after a stop at Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic, is now crossing the Atlantic to Santander where she will be refitted.

WEST OF ENGLAND

Exeter Cruises The SOUTHERN COMFORT began her season on 20 May.

Torpoint Ferry The PLYM II was taken out of service on 29 April and towed to Falmouth for her 5-yearly survey.

M Pill (Kernow Cruises), Falmouth The GLORIA arrived by road from Harwich on 19 May. Her yellow hull has been repainted blue and she will soon start angling trips from the Prince of Wales Pier

Fal River On Thursdays from 1 June there are evening sailings to St Mawes with a last departure from St Mawes at 2145.

Truro River Cruises ceased after a single season with the TRURO BELLE in 2021, with the owners blaming rising costs.

BRISTOL CHANNEL

Lundy Company The OLDENBURG arrived in Bideford 29 May after over six months at Sharpness and resumed running to Lundy on 3 June.

Bristol Ferry Boats There was a major fire in the historic Underfall Yard on 6 May, destroying the company's maintenance base. None of the boats or staff was there at the time. A man has been charged with arson.

MIDLAND WATERWAYS

National Waterways Museum Gloucester The QUEEN BOADICEA II began her season on 31 May. Trips are on Wednesdays to Saturdays at 1200 and 1330. New this year are 2-hour tea and cake cruises on certain afternoons, starting on 10 June.

NORTH WEST

E W & R J Jones, Caernarfon The QUEEN OF THE SEA's season began on 4 June.

IRISH SEA

Isle of Man Steam Packet Co The MANXMAN left Ulsan on 13 May and has called at Hong Kong, Singapore and Colombo on her delivery voyage via the Suez Canal.

Waverley Excursions The WAVERLEY arrived back in Glasgow on 22 June after very successful sailings on the Bristol Channel and from Liverpool, with most sold out in advance. The sailing on 9 June from Swansea and Ilfracombe around Lundy was cancelled because of forecast winds. She began her Clyde season on 23 June as planned. Timetables for the autumn Thames sailings are still awaited.

NORTH EAST and YORKSHIRE

Herm Island has signed a new 5-year contract with Trident who will be paid to provide a year-round service to the island. Since 14 June Trident is the sole operator and the HERM LASS and ISLE OF HERM have ceased operating.

Guernsey Coastal Cruises, a new operator, has bought the GLAD TIDINGS from Seahouses. She arrived from Poole on board the cargo ship TRINITY on 13 June and began running 1½-hour cruises to Saint's Bay on 24 June. Telephone mobile 07839 128338.

Condor Ferries The COMMODORE CLIPPER was at Portland from 13 to 20 September. The CONDOR ISLANDER starts in mid-October, taking overnight sailings from Portsmouth and returning by day, running opposite the COMMODORE CLIPPER. There are no Poole sailings from 31 October to 20 December while the CONDOR VOYAGER runs between St-Malo and the islands. From 6 January to 19 February French sailings are from Cherbourg instead of St-Malo.

London Party Boats have bought the RIVER PRINCESS from Thames Cruises. She was built in 1974 as the CHEVENING and has operated as the RIVER PRINCESS since 2015. London Party Boats was established in 2003 and now has six boats.

Thames River Boats The CONNAUGHT made the last trips of the season to Richmond and Hampton Court on 29 October.

SOUTH COAST

Wightlink The WIGHT LIGHT arrived back in Lympington on 23 October after dry docking in Falmouth.

Greenslade Pleasure Boats, Poole Three-hour bird-watching cruises are offered on various dates this winter by Birds of Poole Harbour (telephone 01202 641003).

CHANNEL ISLANDS

Condor Ferries The CONDOR ISLANDER went from Poole to Portsmouth on 20 October and made her first passenger sailing on the 22nd from Portsmouth to Guernsey. Party Boats, Birmingham, has ceased trading and the ANSON was sold in June. She was built in 1958 for British Waterways' cargo carrying fleet and has run in Birmingham as a passenger boat since being converted in 1972.
